Tavira-based restaurant Jamie's Cozinha will feature pasta and pizza dishes, while restaurant Kohinoor will be serving up spicy Indian dishes, both cuisines that are extremely popular in Britain. And of course, no British Food Festival would be complete without a tasty pasty from Borley's Pies.

For the sweet toothed among you, there will also be Boutique Pão e Pão from Vilamoura, serving up 'The Best Chocolate Cake in the World' as well as 'The Best Pão de Ló in the Universe', among other divinely rich and sinful delights. Tavira-based tea specialists Saboreia Chá e Café will also have a stand to promote teas as well as gourmet products such as chocolates and other goodies, as will the stand from Algarve Gourmet.

For children and the young at heart, and because no fair would be complete without it, there will also be popcorn and candy floss sellers at the event.

Those not wanting a full meal, but perhaps a light snack may be tempted by the Indian snacks and drinks at Samrat's bar.

All that walking in the fabulous Algarve sunshine is bound to make visitors thirsty, which is why there will once again be 'caipirinhas' and cocktails served on the lawn opposite the main pavilion, as well as free wine tastings at the Wine Show and fruity alcohol-free ice drinks 'granizados' available.

Of course, no visit to the International Algarve Fair is complete without a stop at The Portugal News Café. Located inside the main pavilion, visitors will be able to meet and chat to staff from The Portugal News as well as enjoy a freshly brewed coffee, soft drink or traditionally Portuguese 'pastel de nata' custard tart.
